### Mission

2nd Annual Saturation 2010 is a 2-day photographic arts event that brings together Wisconsin professional photo artists, emerging artists, Ozaukee County students, photo art enthusiasts and general public for a weekend long celebration of photo art form. The purpose for Saturation is to cultivate the interest and appreciation for the art form and to engage the community to explore their own creativity with this medium. Saturation includes many opportunities to experience and learn about photo arts including: exhibits by professional and emerging artists, student workshops presented by professional artists, creation of the photo art by students, and the exhibition of student art. This event will touch the lives of many people in the community.

### Student Exhibition Guidelines

1. Children (ages 6-17) from the Ozaukee County are invited to create one 5 x 7" image, print two copies, on the theme "In My Neighborhood".

2. Drop off both prints July 1st from 11-4:30 pm at NSAA, 1111 Broad Street, Grafton WI 53024. One print will be displayed in the exhibition opening August 7th, 2010. All photos will be framed in a Plexiglas frame by NSAA for the families to keep.

Label each print on back in pencil, Student name, address, phone number and parents email. Students will fill out further paperwork at drop off.

Second print will be filed & used for upcoming free workshop August 7th, 2010. All students will receive a certificate for participating.

3. Exhibition will conclude August 25th, 2010.

4. Pick up of framed art is Thursday, August 26th 1-4:30 pm. All art not picked up becomes the property of NSAA.

### August 7th, 2010 - Student Workshops

In addition students will be invited to participate in a free workshop with Visiting Photo Artist, James Prinz on Saturday August 7th. Workshops will be divided into 3 age levels. Students will use their 2nd print to create a large-scale photography collage to be exhibited in the Ozaukee community on a rotating basis over the 2010 fall period. Students will be given details of the workshop when dropping off the 1st print July 1st, 2010. Students must participate in photo show to take advantage of the free workshops.

James Prinz is a 1979 graduate of Grafton High School. He received a BFA from UW-Milwaukee in 1986 and an MFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 1988. Mr. Prinz founded James Prinz Photography in 1987 and works internationally photographing artwork for museums, universities, galleries, collectors and artists. He has had work published in many catalogues, books and also numerous international magazines and newspapers. James Prinz was the staff photographer at the Museum of Contemporary Art In Chicago from 1989 until 1995. He was the principal photographer with the Mellon International Dunhuang Archive at Northwestern University and has traveled to China 15 times to photograph Buddhist caves in the Gobi Desert. His duties with the project also included teaching advanced photographic techniques to members of the Dunhuang Research Academy as well as members of the Cultural Relics Bureau in Beijing. Currently Mr. Prinz has been collaborating with Chicago artist, Nick Cave, and has photographs and videos being exhibited in Cave's traveling museum exhibition, "Meet Me at the Center of the Earth". When not photographing artwork for others, James Prinz produces his own landscape photography.
